<b>put..off (1)</b>	(テレビ・ラジオなど)を消す	Could you <b>put off</b> the TV before you go to bed, please? (turn off)
<b>put..off (2)</b>	...を延期する、遅らせる	We will not <b>put off</b> the event, even if it rains.
<b>put..off ~ (3)</b>	興味を失わせる	A nasty teacher <b>put me off</b> learning English.
<b>put..off ~ (4)</b>	うんざりさせる	Your oyaji-gags really <b>put me off</b> .

<b>run off with~ (1)</b>	...を持ち逃げする	The thief grabbed my camera and <b>ran off with</b> it.
<b>run off with ~ (2)</b>	...と駆け落ちする	She <b>ran off with</b> a man 20 years younger than her.

<b>see ... off</b>	...を見送る	My friends came to the station to <b>see me off</b> .
<b>set off (for)</b>	(~に) 出発する	Before <b>setting off</b> , we should make sure we have our passports.
