<b>run out (1)</b>	走って出ていく	Janet <b>ran out</b> of the room a minute ago.
<b>run out of (2)</b>	...がなくなる、...を使い切る	We have <b>run out of</b> food and money.
<b>run out on (3)</b>	(人を見捨てる)	She <b>ran out on</b> him the day before the wedding.
<b>sit ... out (1)</b>	(我慢して) 最後まで耐え忍ぶ	It was a boring class but I had to <b>sit it out</b> until the end.
<b>sit ... out (2)</b>	(活動などに) 加わらない	I think I will <b>sit</b> this dance <b>out</b> .
<b>stick ... out of (1)</b>	(...から) 突き出す	It is a bad idea to <b>stick</b> your head <b>out of</b> the window.
<b>stick out (2)</b>	目立つ、重要である	What <b>sticks out to</b> me more than his education is his experience.

<b>see... out</b>	(玄関などまで) 見送る	My assistant will <b>see you out</b> .
<b>set out for/on</b>	(に向かって) 出発する	He <b>set out on</b> his journey in the morning.
<b>stand out</b>	目立つ( <b>stick out</b> ともいう)	He is the kind of guy that <b>stands out</b> in a crowd.
