<b>run ... over (3)</b>	(車で)~を引く、はねる	My stupid neighbour <b>ran over</b> my dog.
<b>take ... over (1)</b>	(to~)...を(~のところへ)持っていく	She <b>took</b> the cake <b>over</b> to the dining table.
<b>take ... over (2)</b>	(仕事など)を引き継ぐ	No one volunteered to <b>take over</b> his job.
