<b>take ~ along</b>	連れていく	Are you going to <b>take along</b> your husband to the concert?
<b>come along (1)</b>	一緒に行く	Do you mind if I <b>come along</b> with you to Tenmaya?
<b>come along (2)</b>	上達する	How's your English <b>coming along</b> ? It's coming along great!
<b>get along with</b>	仲良くやってる	I don't really <b>get along with</b> my husband anymore.
<b>go along (with) (1)</b>	… (と) 同行する	Everyone else is going to Aeon mall, so I'll <b>go along</b> too.
<b>go along with (2)</b>	… (に) 同調する	I decided to <b>go along with</b> my husband's plan to buy a new car.
